Regular meetings were held with the departmental heads and conveners regarding completion of syllabus, teaching-learning methods adopted and academic performance of the students. Time table for regular theory and practical classes was prepared by the head of department in the beginning of new academic session and displayed in the student notice board and also submitted to principal. At the end of session, principal examines whether the entire syllabus has been completed as per the initial planning and appropriate steps were initiated. The efforts were made to involve all the teachers to corporate work of the college. The IQAC encourage the faculty members to use latest technological tools in delivering lectures and interacting with students in class room. The departments prepared the report of all organized activities and also monitor the student progress and achievements. The IQAC also collects the data of student achievements from the department at the end of session. The College ensures the optimal allocation and utilization of the funds for maintenance of infrastructure and purchase of new equipment. The proposal for fund is submitted by concern department to the principal. The purchase committee of the college reviews the proposal, which is further approved by the principal. Construction, maintenance and repairing of academic buildings, library, classrooms, electrical appliances and other physical infrastructure of college is done by the authorized government organizations nominated by Govt. of U. P. The quotations are invited and the equipment is purchased from the vendor with the lowest quote as per Govt. of India. The record of the equipment is maintained in the stock register. The college receives grant from the directorate higher education, Allahabad, U.P. under Non Plan Head. Non Plan Head mentions the assigned budget for procurement of different items which include chemicals and glassware, sport items, equipment and contingency. Under Non-Plan Head, maintenance and security of physical infrastructure is also done, such as telephone services, office expenses, CCTV surveillance etc. While purchasing equipment from any fund, it is always ensured that the installation charges and maintenance charges within warranty period are provided the company, which delivers the equipment. Portion of the fund received under RUSA scheme has been utilized for up gradation, purchasing of scientific equipment, repairing of the existing laboratories and other existing infrastructure.
