
Feedback Proforma and its Aanalysis (Session: 2016-17)

The subsequent pages show the proforma and resultant analysed by the IQAC.





Best Practice 1:

1. Title of the Practice: The Culture of Organizing Conferences/ Workshop on Regular Interval

2. Goal

To make students aware of current areas of knowledge and research trend and also to make them acquainted of modern gadgets of presentation.

3. The Context

The college is situated in rural area and modern technology for seeking higher education through interaction is still not adequately available to the students coming from villages. In order to open up students to modern spheres of knowledge and current issues the college has started to organise conferences/ seminars and workshops at department, college and national levels.

4. The Practice

In this session the science faculty of college has organized national conference on "Energy, Environment and its Impact on Society" (19-20 January, 2017).

5. Evidence of Success

The national conference was successful with more than 150 participants taking part them. The present challenges as well as the possibilities and emerging technologies in the area of energy conservation, protection of environment and sustainable development are discussed. This conference provided a chance of interaction with eminent resource persons through their lectures and personal deliberations. The student presentation has been found to be very helpful in boosting the confidence level of the students.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

All these activities need a decent infrastructural setting and the institute definitely lacks much. There is virtually complete absence of AV rooms at present and all these activities have to be undertaken in makeshift arrangements. Fund availability is also a big constraint.

Best Practice 2:

1. Title of the Practice

Established and Strengthened Departmental Cooperative Library

2. Goal

To give PG students better chance of getting through more text and reference books.

3. The Context

The central library is facing an acute deficiency of librarian and supporting staff for the last five years and the problem is further aggravated by more retirement of staff. This necessitates some dedicated effort by teaching staff for providing reading facilities to students.

4. The Practice

Science faculty departments such as Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology are maintaining their departmental libraries for more than one decade with no government funding. Recently departments like

Economics, Sanskrit and English have also started departmental libraries. These libraries also provide for the photocopies of important chapters of costly reference books.

5. Evidence of Success

The target of such libraries is to cater to the needs of PG students by providing books and other study materials provided by teachers and alumni of the department. These libraries have proved highly successful as the students are able to exchange the issued books in their respective departments easily. Books are also donated to the library by teachers (present and past) and also by alumni.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

The books of PG level are usually costly and thus there is definitely lack of funds is experienced. Further lack of adequate supporting staff puts more pressure on teachers on teachers in smooth functioning of libraries.
